This is a fantastic dream which will never be achieved until Mankind has matured, and certainly no Town Planning or Architectural Design of any kind can solve the problems raging inside of an immature species.

I hope I havent offended but on greater contemplation of Victory Cities I find there are greater things at stake - perhaps you would like to comment on what I have said, I would certainly be interested in hearing anything you have to say.
