

specially designed of stainless steel with a stainless steel wash-basin welded directly into the wall. They will be mass produced as a complete unit in a factory and shipped into VC and installed with the units locking on to each other to form a wall between the exits and the serving lanes.

The type of water-pik appliance that families buy cost around \$25-\$30 each. Figuring that each water-pik appliance were used by an average of 2 people, then it would cost about \$500 for the 36 people who use just one water-pik booth. By buying 6,324 booths for just one city and tens of thousands more for other VC's should get the unit price down to a fraction of \$500, perhaps \$100 per booth.

By having thousands of these booths so close and convenient to the cafeteria, many people who are not now acquainted with water-piks will become so, and everybody will be encouraged to use them.

The water-pik attachment that everyone will carry in their pocket could be issued either free or for a slight cost at the time a person first obtains his bankbook when his application is accepted.

VICTORY CITY FREE NEWSPAPER

There will be just one newspaper permitted in VC and it will be owned and operated by VC. It will be truly free in the sense that every person living in VC shall have the right to write an editorial or message of substantial length and have it published without any censorship at all. Exceptions will be: the misuse of the free message privilege for free advertising for some product or service, inflammatory statements designed to incite people to riot or rebellion or any criminal act, legal or medical advice or information by other than a lawyer or doctor, mentioning names of private persons, slander that could make either the writer or VC legally liable for damages.

The free messages will be printed in three distinct sections of the newspaper under headings in bold type:

Highly Recommended

Acceptable

Not Recommended

They will appear in the newspaper in the above order. The bulk of the material may appear in the "Acceptable" section. Only one or two up to a maximum of perhaps 12 articles would appear in the "Highly Recommended" section daily.

Uninteresting, poorly written articles using bad grammar and containing vulgar, obscene language and four letter words will be printed in the "Not Recommended" section.
