Victory City & VC Cafeteria

Dear Mr. Doerges:

Since your feeding requirements are for scattered restaurants serving "1400 per hour," a standard Circl-Serv cafeteria might best meet your needs. This highly advanced and efficient equipment is manufactured by the B.W. Metals Co. in Fairfield, Ohio near Cincinnati. In 1974 there were only 9 installations nationwide. Now there are hundreds. Recently they have increased the size of their office and manufacturing plant by 50% as business is booming. I do not represent this company, but I am enclosing some of their literature in case you might like to write to them directly. Their president is Donald Barnhill and the company is owned by Homer Duff.

The Circl-Serv completely eliminates long waiting lines such as you have in old obsolete straight line cafeterias. That means your customers will have more time to spend more money at Epcot and Disney World.

The Circl-Serv is a large rotating counter where  $\frac{2}{3}$  of it is located in the cafeteria for serving and  $\frac{1}{3}$  in the kitchen for loading.

#### Victory City Cafeteria

For the purposes of Victory City, in order to feed 13,000 people in 3 hours, I have changed this arrangement so that the kitchen would be on one floor and the cafeteria on a floor above. Food would be brought up through the center of the Circl-Serv. There would be loading on 100% of the inner part of the rotating counter and 100% serving on the outer part.

People would approach the Circl-Serv from the 3rd floor across a glass enclosed bridge to a circular ramp where they would board one of 48 ferris wheels, then take a  $\frac{1}{4}$  turn stopping midway between top and bottom at the Circl-Serv where they can get their food in 30 seconds, then another  $\frac{1}{4}$  turn down to the dining area where they emerge surrounded by a ring of cashiers. After paying their bill, they go out in all directions to their table. After finishing their meal they would leave by an exit lined with water-pik booths.
